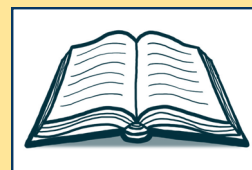

DASH'S QUESTION BOX



Dear Dash,

Do you know how the daily colors of the vestments are chosen? ~ *dbaum*

Dear *dbaum* ~

I'm colorblind, but the different vestments smell different to me, so I can explain it this way.

The greeny smelling vestments are ordinary days. That's because ordinary days are always days for growing, and green things grow.

The red smelling vestments are to celebrate feast days of martyrs who shed their red blood for Jesus.

The purple vestments are for Advent and Lent which are times of preparation and waiting. Just think of how the night sky yields for a short while to violet and purplish hues, just before the sun breaks at dawn.

White vestments are for saints who are not martyrs. We celebrate how they spread light to the world by wearing white, the one color that contains all the other colors. It's also why we use white for Christmas and Easter and for the Blessed Virgin Mary.
