

PASTORAL COUNCIL MEETINGS

On April 10 & 24 our Pastoral Council met in open session at each of the Parish sites.

The **Agenda** was comparable at both meetings:

Census Results were noted with 691 registered households in St. Mark Parish & 355 registered households in St. Martin Parish.

Social Events in previous weeks were recalled: Fish Frys, Potluck Game Nights, Corn Beef Dinner, & Donut Sundays; and in the future BBQ, Potluck Game Nights & the September Fall Festival.

Liturgical Life included Christmas, Lenten and Easter celebrations; with an upcoming First Communion & May Crowning.

Programs of Faith Formation broadened to include a "God's Word Proclaimed" Scripture Study & "Prepare Your Heart".

Parish Repairs included completion of a new HVAC & on-going implementation of the new roofs on the school & rectory at St. Mark, with multiple leaks at St. Matthias; as well as partial repairs to leaks in St. Martin's church, & repairs to some vandalism at St. Andrew.

Parish Finance Council Members were announced for both parishes: Peter Soderquist, Zach Rasure, & Jeff Preisack to serve St. Mark & Marilyn Schulte, Joe Reynolds & Apollo Westrich to serve St. Martin along with clergy.

The Third Quarter Report (included this week) was also discussed at St. Martin.

Leases of our various buildings were raised with requests for multi-year leases for St. Mark & St. Martin schools.

There has of yet been no word on the status of the St. Bernadette property.

Next Pastoral Council open session will be held August 21, 2025.





- St. Mark Extraordinary Deficit came from the loss in investment earnings for the quarter.

 Extraordinary Expense came from organizational expenses (Ladies Guild), steam pipe repairs at St. Andrew, a water leak & repairs to leaks in St. Matthias Gym.
- **St. Martin** *Extraordinary Income* came from organizational proceeds (Bingo, Quilter's & Men's Club). *Extraordinary Expense* came from Men's club, & repairs to the school boiler.

A Shared Extraordinary Expense came from a snow plow installation which benefits at both parishes.
