

THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

Repetition often dulls our sense of the deeper truths found within the Holy Mass—and as our national day of gratitude approaches, I've been nudged by the Holy Spirit to share a reflection.

Every day, as a priest, in the Preface of the Eucharistic Prayer, I initiate and lead what should be beautiful dialogue between God and His People—reminding us all that thanksgiving is the primary motive and emotion that should always arise in our hearts, to be expressed in our thoughts, words and deeds.

As you read these words, recall how their meaning could change our outlook on life.

"The Lord be with you." — This is not merely a pious wish, but a firm reminder of the central truth that truly God is with us always!

"Lift up your hearts." — Again shouldn't we be jolted by this phrase which calls us beyond our complacency, doubts, fears, and even sins, —to set our sights for the fullness of God's will for us each day?

"Let us give thanks to the Lord our God" — Shouldn't this overwhelming invitation cause us to marvel at the magnitude and multiplicity of all God has provided?

"It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation always and everywhere to give you thanks Lord, Holy Father, Almighty and Eternal God, Through Jesus Christ Our Lord." — I then speak directly to God, not just on one Thursday in November but throughout time to voice our unending gratitude for us all.

How often have we allowed our prayer to settle into a common litany of understated complaints or dissatisfaction with one thing or another?

A deeper reflection, appreciation, gratitude and thanksgiving is what we need to be rightly grounded as sincere believers.

So, brothers and sisters, enjoy the coming holiday, but remember Thanksgiving needs to be our daily goal in order to do justice to God, Our Father, as Jesus, Himself teaches.


