

ASSOCIATE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE


Fr. Bob will be completing his much-needed vacation this weekend and will be back with us this coming week, ready to jump back into the shepherding of his flocks. Please welcome him back when you see him and keep him in your prayers as he continues to serve our parishes' needs.

A couple weekends ago there was a third-page article in the Post Dispatch quoting me as saying "sale of church land and buildings have always been top of mind for the Archdiocese." That could not be further from the truth. The primary mission of this Archdiocese is and always has been pastoral ministry for the salvation of souls. Our archdiocesan, vicariate, deanery and parish clergy and associates are all working for our people's spiritual good and physical well-being.

It is certainly true that those given pastoral authority over the parishes which have had to undergo realignment over the last year are tasked also with the upkeep of all the buildings that have come from the subsumation in All Things New. They have the responsibility of determining the best present and future use, and the possible relinquishing, of said properties. The change and loss of the use of these buildings has been and continues to be felt as a death to be mourned by all who have a family and personal history with them. Fr. Bob and I are greatly aware of the sad affect that such losses have on all concerned. We too have mourned churches and schools that have changed hands and closed. And so we continue to strive to help everyone through the mourning process. Just like when we have lost a loved one to death. there is no timetable for the end of mourning the loss of parish churches and schools that have been of personal significance. And we will always try to make ourselves available to anyone who needs help to work through their mourning.

Please allow us to accompany you through that mourning and do not hesitate to express your hurt when you feel the need. We continue to pray for all who are struggling with the changes. It can be a long process and we recognize that each person has their own reaction to and way of processing such loss.

AFFTON CHRISTIAN FOOD PANTRY DONORS & VOLUNTEERS

The results are in! In 2024 St. Mark parishioners donated 4,845 pounds of canned goods and personal care items in the three containers at Church (Cry Room, Vestibule and Cafeteria) to the Affton Christian Food Pantry.

In addition, the food drives we had during the year generated another 2,346 pounds of donated canned goods.

Our 2024 grand total is 7,191 pounds of donated canned goods and personal care items plus \$2,247 in cash and checks.

In addition, we now have about 10 parishioners who volunteer their time stocking shelves, doing pick-ups from stores and working with ACFP clients.




WHAT'S A PILGRIMAGE?
