



ALL THINGS NEW UPDATE FROM THE ARCHDIOCESE

Recently, a team of nearly 50 volunteers, including religious orders, Kenrick-Glennon Seminary faculty and staff, associate pastors, permanent deacons and lay people synthesized all the information the Archdiocese of St. Louis has received regarding its 178 parishes during the All Things New pastoral planning initiative. Information gathered included feedback from key parish leaders, parish listening sessions, online surveys, individual letters and emails. The summaries will be another important piece of information as Archbishop Mitchell Rozanski makes a final decision on the future of the parishes.

The volunteers were asked to follow four guidelines: that they offer a fair representation of what people said; include the real contradictions and tensions reflected in the feedback; offer the good ideas and key insights shared; and ensure they are concise. Volunteers were not allowed to synthesize any information for parishes in their own planning area.

The initial draft of the parish feedback summaries have been shared with pastors, who were asked to share the summaries with their Key Parish Leaders and provide feedback. *Every parish feedback summary is now public at allthingsnew.com.* You should contact your parish office for more information if you do not have access to the internet. All of this is geared toward the Archbishop making a well-informed, discerned decision for the spiritual well-being of the Archdiocese, looking at the feedback of the people and the needs of the Archdiocese.

The All Things New planning committee is expected to refine the draft models to one model per planning area. Armed with the feedback summaries, parish workbooks and financial data, the team will analyze each model to ensure each one has the resources to sustain the new structure. Another round of draft model options will be shared with the priests in early February, with a period of feedback. Other factors will come under consideration, including redrawing maps of the archdiocese and priest reassignments.


It is expected that by the end of April, Archbishop Rozanski will have met with Consultors to review final draft models, and then he will have a month to pray and discern before announcing a final decision on May 28, the feast of Pentecost. Implementation of these plans will take effect beginning in fall 2023 through 2026.

Please continue to pray for the gift of true discernment so that we may continue to do the Will of God in all things.

St. Porphyrius of Gaza (c. 347–420)

St. Porphyry was bishop of Gaza from 395 to 420, which makes him contemporary to St. Jerome and St. Augustine. He was known for having done the very dangerous work of Christianizing a remaining stubborn and violent stronghold of paganism in Gaza, converting them to the Catholic Faith through much prayer and evangelization.

St. Porphyry's Feast Day is February 26.



St. Martin of Tours (c. 316–397)

St. Martin of Tours was originally from present day Hungary. His holiness was so apparent to all that he became the

> first saint of the Church Universal who, though not a martyr, was canonized for his greatness.

Examination of state of our soul towards God According to St. Francis de Sales

- 1. What is the state of your heart with respect to mortal sin? Are you firmly resolved never to commit it, come what may? And have you kept that resolution from the time you first made it? Here is the foundation of the spiritual life.
- 2. How do you stand towards the commandments of God? Are they acceptable, light, and easy to you? He who has a good digestion and healthy appetite likes good food and turns away from that which is bad.
- 3. How do you stand towards venial sins? No one can help committing some such occasionally; but are there none to which you have any special tendency, or worse still, any actual liking and clinging?
- 4. With respect to spiritual exercises—do you like and value them or do they weary and vex you? To which do you feel most or least disposed, hearing or reading God's Word, meditating upon it, calling upon God, confession, preparing for and receiving communion, controlling your inclinations? What of all these is most distasteful to you? And if you find that your heart is not disposed to any of these things, inquire into the cause, find out whence the disinclination comes.
- 5. With respect to God himself: does your heart delight in thinking of God, does it crave after the sweetness thereof? Do you feel a certain readiness to love him, and a definite inclination to enjoy his love? Do you take pleasure in dwelling upon the immensity, the goodness, the tenderness of God? When you are immersed in the occupations and vanities of this world, does the thought of God come across you as a welcome thing? Do you

accept it gladly, and yield yourself up to it, and your heart turn with a sort of yearning to him? There are souls that do so.

- 6. If a wife has been long separated from her husband, so soon as she sees him returning, and hears his voice, however encumbered she may be with business, or forcibly hindered by the pressure of circumstances, her heart knows no restraint, but turns at once from all else to think upon him she loves. So it is with souls who really love God, however engrossed they may be; when the thought of him is brought before them, they forget all else for joy at feeling his dear presence, and this is a very good sign.
- 7. With respect to Jesus Christ as God and man—how does your heart draw to him? Honeybees seek their delight in their honey, but wasps hover over stinking carrion. Even so pious souls draw all their joy from Jesus Christ, and love him with an exceeding sweet love, but those who are careless find their pleasure in worldly vanities.
- 8. With respect to Our Lady, the saints, and your guardian angel—do you love them well? Do you rejoice in the sense of their guardianship? Do you take pleasure in their lives, their pictures, their memories?
- 9. As to your tongue—how do you speak of God? Do you take pleasure in speaking his praise and singing his glory in psalms and hymns?
- 10. As to actions—have you God's visible glory at heart, and do you delight in doing whatever you can to honor him? Those who love God will love to adorn and beautify his house. Are you conscious of having ever given up anything you liked, or of renouncing anything for God's sake? It is a good sign when we deprive ourselves of something we can for on behalf of those we love. What have you ever given up for the love of God?
